Bike Ride

Bike Safety - Wear your Hat!

Check your Bike: Brakes, Tyres are all working before

Plan your route.. do you have any fast roads? Be Careful! STOP! Make are you listen to the adult!

Take a backpack: Water, Pump, Map, Phone and notebook
On your rest stop - write down what/who you have seen - trees, birds, people!

Litter Pick

Be Safe - Wear gloves!
DO NOT PICK UP ANYTHING SHARP OR ANIMAL POO

Plan your route - local roads or park.

Make a Plan of where you have picked any litter (crisp packets and plastic bottles)
Take a bag
Take photos of the litter - What is it mainly? Plastic? Paper? Glass?

Make a bar chart

Does this change with the area or time?

in the Garden

Be Safe - Wear gloves!

Make a Plan of your Garden
Draw the boundary. (Mark out 5m with a measuring tape and count how many normal walking steps you cover in that distance - divide this number by 5 and thats 1m - (say Captain Alice walks 10 steps in 5m then $10/5 = 2$ steps per meter)

What plants have you got where? Trees? Flower beds?Shed?

Walk by the river

Be Safe - stay away from the edge!

Take a notebook and pencils
Water is calming!
Be quiet and listen for the birds

Stop on a bridge, listen and watch the water flowing
Look what plants and trees are growing. Do you know their names?

Draw the scene from the bridge.
Draw the bridge from the footpath. Take a break - have a snack on a bench. Make up a story with river words

Make a Bug Hotel

Be Safe - Hand tools Required!

Find some wood on your walk.
Some sticks - Some Bark - Some leaves
Get some garden string.
You need to tie up the sticks and bark into loose bundles - not too tight - so bugs can make nice rooms.. Make a pattern of these bundles - Sticks, Leaves, Bark..and then tie all together in a roll
Leave this to rest in your garden: some where sheltered (under a bush in the shade)
Get a piece of wood and drill 1cm holes equal distances in a pattern

Collect a rainbow

Always be careful what you pick up!

ONLY pick the colours of the rainbow - leaves or flowers

DO NOT pick whole flowers (bees need them for food)

See of there are any leaves or petals on the ground
Take photos of plants and flowers - how cloise can you zoom in?
Did you see any Bees? Bees are slow in the spring..give them a sugar and water solution (NEVER Honey)

Go for a walk

Every day go for a walk
It may be around the block
Go and look at the blossom and the trees and plants emerging into spring!
See what plants and flowers and animals you can see - there will be lambs in the fields!
Get your wellies on and take a flask and snacks and a paper map!
Make a map of where you went and what you saw..did you discover a new playpark? or see some cute animals?

Bird Spotting

Every day go for a walk on that walk :
STOP and LISTEN

Be quiet and see how many different birds you may see/hear..
record the birdsong
take photos of the birds

Learn about Migration and different species - all these are related to Dinosaurs!!

Walk to recycling Point

If you have a recycling point near you:

Take a few items and walk to it.
FIND OUT:
What is Glass made from?
What is Plastic made from?
What is in paper?

Make a graph of how many recycled items you have

Check items in the cupboard - are they made from recycled materials? check the signs for recycling items

Do a Garden Survey

This activity can be done in a park too!

Take a hula hoop or a piece of rope/string to make a circle

Place it on the ground.. try on path and grass - be careful on flower beds

Draw a circle on a piece of paper and note down what is in your circle
Look closer - can you see any animals? How big is your circle - measure with a ruler?
Put a scale on your drawing.
How many flowers are there?
