



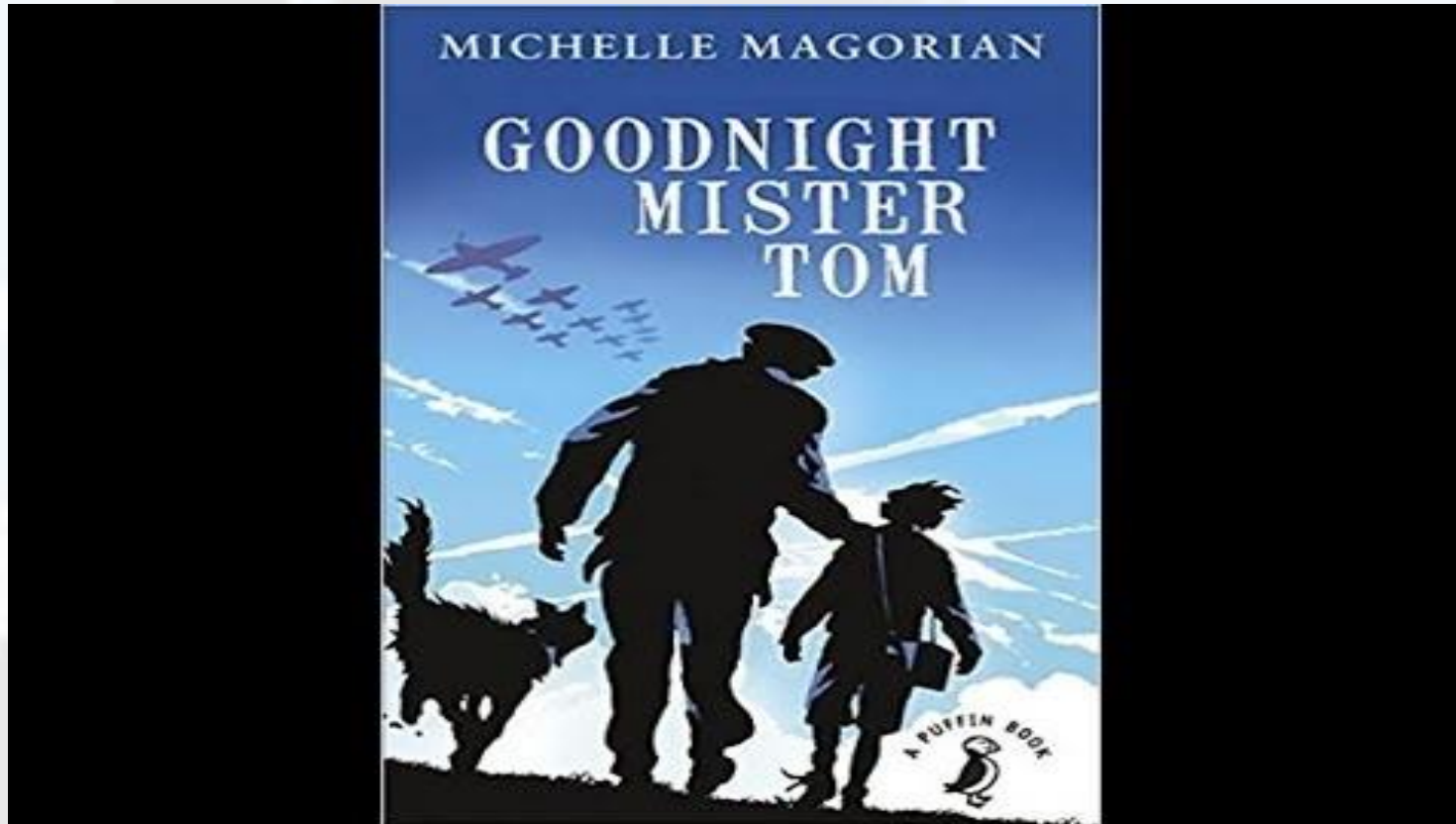

## Postscript

Vocabulary	What does postscript mean? How can you tell Carrie is filled with anticipation? Define 'crestfallen'.
Infer	Why is Carrie doubtful about wearing Will's shorts? Why do Carrie's eyes fill with tears? Who does Carrie imitate?
Predict	Predict what Carrie wants to see. If there was a sequel, what do you think it would be about?
Explain	Did you like the story?
Retrieve	Why had they dug up all the flowers? What does Will suggest that Carrie wears? Why does Carrie get the urge to giggle? Why do you think Carrie's mum has been horrid?
Summarise	Summarise the whole story in less than 200 words.
