Hi Everyone,

We have a lovely week this week and have been very busy!

In Phonics we have been practising how to read longer words such as 'ladder' and 'rabbit' by covering half the word with our finger and reading each half separately and then blending the two 'words' together. Next week we will begin our revision of Phase 3 sounds by repeating the teaching and playing some games.

In Understanding the World we learnt about constellations and the children had a go at designing their own constellation and naming them. In Art the children made galaxy pictures using the style of drip painting by Jackson Pollock.

In English the children wrote about their wonderful costumes that they wore at World Book Day and in Maths the children practised making number 8 in different ways and how to write it.

Today, the children have had an amazing day! The children had to visit the classrooms in KS1 and conduct a Science experiment in each. In Reception class they made rockets and learnt about how a rocket leaves the ground by the force of thrust. The children then used air or their breath as a source of fuel to create thrust to move their rocket. In Year 1 the children tried out some undersea yoga and how animals live in the sea and Year 2 the children learnt about metamorphosis and made a caterpillar and butterfly mobile. In the afternoon the children learnt about sleep, brushing our teeth and how important these are for a healthy body. They listened to lullabies and talked about bedtime routines. Lastly, Year 6 invited us to visit their classroom and take part in some computer quizzes they had made especially for Wren Class. It has been a really fun day!
