



Wren Class Newsletter - Week Beginning 20/09/2021.

The children started their week in the forest with Mrs Miles and Mrs Ward. They learnt about the Forest School rules to keep them safe and then spent some time exploring the mud kitchen, tree climbing and bug hunting. The children will have Forest School for the whole morning every week on Mondays. Both Mrs Miles and Mrs Ward commented on how good the children were at listening and everyone had a great time!

During our mini phonics sessions we have been practising listening to initial sounds and matching words that rhyme. We are hoping to start our phonics lessons on Monday 4th October following the 'Little Wandle' phonics scheme.

During our Literacy lesson, the children listened to the story 'Funny Bones'. They then all took part in labelling the body parts of Mrs Leitch!

In our Maths lessons the children explored some 2D shapes and designed a 2D shape picture. We also talked about 'longer' and 'shorter' and comparing the height or length of different objects.

We have had a go at a few handwriting lessons too. The children warm up and exercise their hands and arms using play dough or streamers and dance along to a pop song in our 'dough disco' session. They then sit at a table and practise tracing over different shapes.

The children also had their first 'Jigsaw' PSHE lesson (Personal, Social, Health and Economic). They were introduced to our class jigsaw piece teddy, Jigsaw Jenny. We talked about our favourite toys and that we are unique but are all the same as we belong to Wren Class in Cheapside School. Please could you upload a photo of your child's favourite toy so that we can put it into their PSHE book.

The children had their Religious Education lesson with Mrs Spong and talked about what makes a good friend. The children then talked about why their own friends are special.

Lastly, the children had a go on the climbing frame and adventure trail. They all had a go at balancing and climbing and had a great time.

Next week the children will be listening to and completing activities about 'Stick Man'. Please can the children collect some small twigs and leaves that can be glued onto paper as they will be making their own Stick Man families.
