



Wren Class Newsletter - Week Beginning 28/09/2020.

The children have been amazing this week and have adapted very well to meeting the other half of the class. The children have been put into their house teams of either Oak (red), Willow (yellow), Birch (blue) or Ash (green) and introduced themselves to the class.

This week we have been looking at 'The History of Me' and talking about ourselves. The children have discussed how we have changed since we were a baby, what our favourite things are and what job we would like to do when we grow up. Thank you for all the baby photos, the children enjoyed looking for the pictures around the classroom and guessing who the baby was. The children completed some lovely self-portraits that we will display in the classroom.

We also read the story 'Funny Bones' and talked about our skeleton and parts of our body. The children had a go at labelling Mrs Coe and each other!

Next week we are hoping to complete our Baseline observations by the end of the week and hope to start more structured teaching following this. The children will continue our Dough Disco sessions and practise writing their name and mark making.

Reminders:
