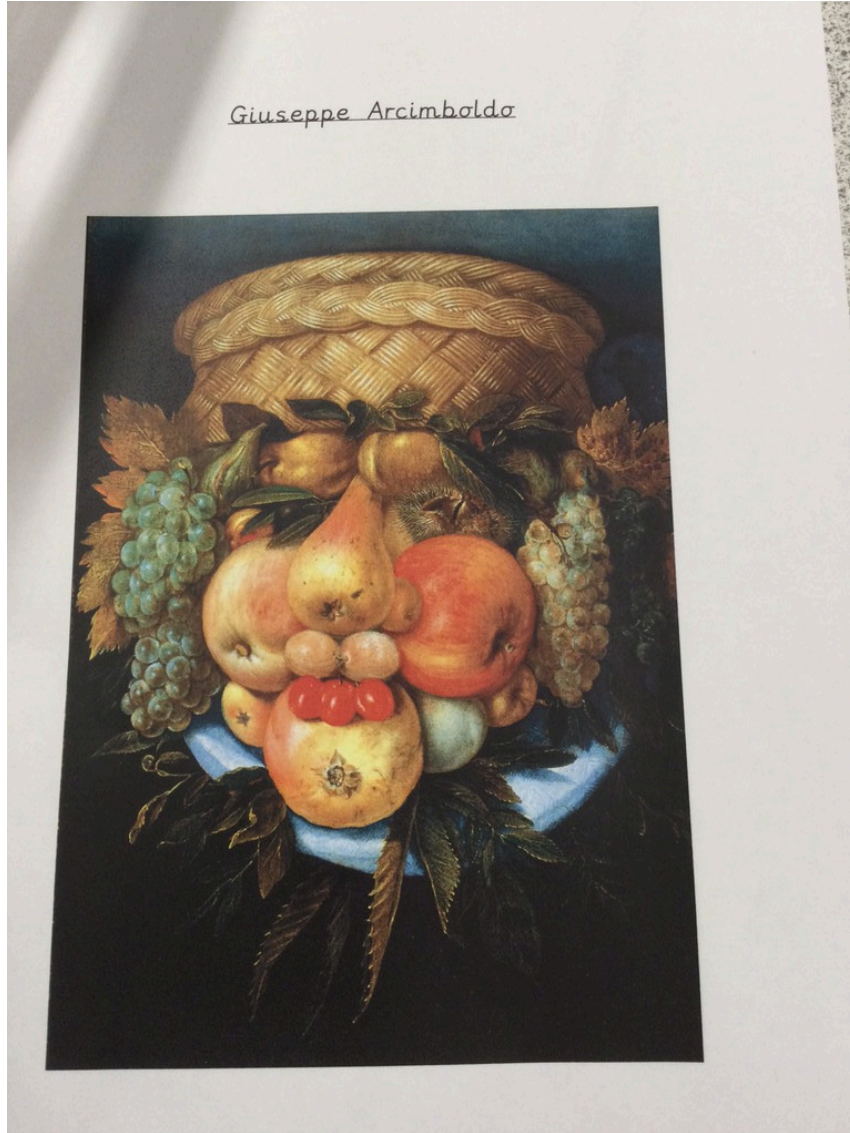


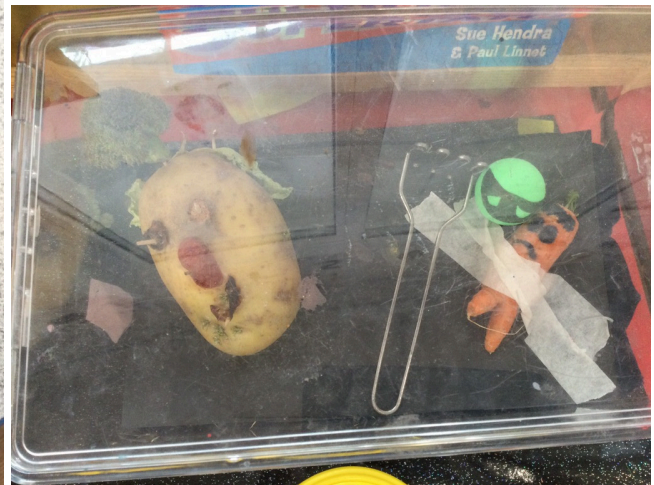

Hi Everyone,

Apologies for not writing a Newsletter over the last few weeks but here is a summary of what we have been doing.

The children really enjoyed reading the story 'Supertato' and made some fantastic potato people using different types of vegetables. The children also wrote a sentence about their potato person. This followed with 'Oliver's Fruit Salad' and we discussed what things were healthy to eat. The children wrote a shopping list/recipe and then chopped up and ate their own fruit salad. Last week we read the story 'Superworm' and the children made a picture, using a wool worm, and wrote about what their 'worm' would be. This week we have made and written Father's Day cards and also completed a piece of writing to see if the children could write a sentence without an adult supporting them. All the children were very brave and had a go!

PSHE (Jigsaw) - The children have learnt about the importance of keeping clean, especially washing hands and conducted an experiment with bread. The bread was touched with clean hands, dirty hands and wiped over the computer table and the children noticed that the bread touched with dirt hands developed more germs (mould) than the clean bread. We have also discussed what to do if we feel lonely, who our family are and safer strangers.

RE - we have continued to listen to and discuss fables from around the world.



In Phonics we have continued to practise Phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs and Phase 4 'blends'. Blends are two consonant letters that are next to each other and make two sounds. These sounds are sometimes difficult to hear such as 'st', 'pl', 'dr', 'br', etc. All the children are doing well with their reading.

Maths - We have learnt about odd and even numbers and that all the ones in even numbers have a partner and odd numbers have an odd one left out (no friend/partner). The children made objects out of 3D shapes and went on a 3D shape hunt. The last two weeks the children have learnt about 'teen' numbers and that they are made of 1 x ten and ones. They have practised making them out of cubes, counters on ten frames, Numicon and bead strings. The children have also continued to practise their recall of number bonds to 5 and 10 by visiting Mrs Lopez's shop and purchasing two items that make 5 or 10.

Art - The children drew a pencil sketch of a face inspired by the artist Giuseppe Arcimboldo who painted portraits of faces with fruit and vegetables as features.

PE - the children have practised sports day activities and cricket skills with Mrs Higgins.

Forest School - the children have been exploring mini beasts and made a beetle bucket for beetles to live in. This week the children made a Father's Day frame by weaving wool across a stick frame and collecting items to decorate it with.

Last week the children enjoyed learning about D Day and especially enjoyed their picnic with Year 6 on the school field. This week the children attended a Fairy Tale Drama workshop and joined in with the Drama teacher acting out fairy stories.

Next week we will be learning about King Charles and the Royal Family and have our own tea tent in the outdoor area. We will be waving at the Royal Procession and visiting the tea tent on Wednesday so if you are free to come and help us look after the children that would be great!
