Hi Everyone,

Here is a summary of our learning in Wren Class last week.



In our Phonics lessons the children have been learning how to say the sounds made by the letters g,o,c and k and blending simple words containing the sounds that they have learnt so far. We will be holding a Reading Information Evening on 2nd November at 7pm. We strongly recommend parents to attend this evening as we will be sharing up to date information on how Phonics is now taught at Cheapside and how you can help support your child at home. We will also be handing out your child's 'reading pack' and their first reading book. The children who are now blending will have a book containing words and children who are not quite ready to read, will have a book without words.

In our Literacy lessons we held a 'Drawing Club' session and after listening to the story 'The Hairy Toe', about a lady that finds a hairy toe, the children drew a picture of who or what they thought the hairy toe belonged to. In the second session the children decided what happened to the hairy toe at the end of the story.

On Tuesday in their Jigsaw PSHE lesson the children continued to discuss their rights and how they are responsible for helping everyone to achieve them. Mrs Barter gave them a small teddy counter that they had to be responsible for and look after whilst they played. It was interesting to see who 'lost' their teddy counter and who had managed to look after it at the end of the session!

In our handwriting lessons we have practised writing the letters g & o, starting at the top of each letter and saying the rhyme as we write it.

In our Forest School session the children used their wellies as intended and spent ages splashing in all the deep puddles around the school! They tried to catch raindrops and made leaf pictures by sticking damp leaves to tarpaulin. When we returned to the classroom Mrs Miles helped the children make paper wreathes and showed them how to make a magic picture that is revealed when it put into a bowl of water! The children loved this!

In our Maths lessons this week we looked at comparing amounts of objects and using the words 'more' and 'fewer'.

Have a lovely half term and I will see you on Monday 30th October ready for our first PE lesson with Mrs Higgins!
