Hi Everyone,

I hope you have all had a lovely weekend!

Here is a summary of our learning in Wren Class last week.

In our phonics lessons, the children have been learning how to say the sounds made by the letters i,n,m, & d and have been practising blending simple CVC words containing these sounds. Please have a look at our class page for links to videos on how to practise blending both visually and orally with your children.

In our Literacy lessons we have been reading the book 'Stick Man' and made our family out of stick and leaves. The children had a go at writing the initial sound of some of their family's names.



On Tuesday in their Jigsaw PSHE lesson, the children discussed ideas about what our rights are and made a list of rules to help achieve these rights.

In our handwriting lessons we have practised writing the letters i,n,m,d starting at the top of each letter, apart from 'd' where we start in the middle. It is important that the children remember the handwriting rhyme for each letter, which you can on our class page.

On Thursday the children enjoyed a walk up to the church with Year 6 and performed their rendition of 'Dingle Dangle Scarecrow' with Y1 and Y2. They were brilliant considering how long they walked and sat in the church. It was lovely to hear the whole school singing the harvest songs that we had practised over the last few weeks.

In our Maths lessons this week we read the story 'The Button Box' and practised different ways of sorting objects, e.g., by colour, shape, size, etc.

The children really enjoyed our RE lesson this week, learning about why some people think Jesus was special. We watched a cartoon which showed the story of Jesus healing a paralysed man and discussed if we thought Jesus was special and why or why not.

Finally, we ended the week with a visit from Year 6 who helped the children decorate and write their name.
