British Science Week

We've had another jam-packed week here at Cheapside celebrating Science Week in style! It's been wonderful to see our children's natural curiosity and enthusiasm for the world around them come alive across the school.

Year 5 Visit: Winchester Space Museum

On Monday, Year 5 made an exciting trip to Winchester Space Museum as part of their Spring term topic. The visit gave pupils a fantastic opportunity to bring their classroom learning to life, exploring the wonders of space and science first-hand. We hope the children came home brimming with facts- and perhaps a few big questions for the grown-ups!

Spring Parents' Evening

On Wednesday and Thursday, we opened our doors to parents and transformed our corridors into a vibrant showcase of learning. Every core subject was represented, giving our community a window into the impressive progress our children have made throughout the Spring term. It was a joy to see the children's pride and confidence as they discussed their learning with such enthusiasm. These moments are a powerful reminder of how much grows when children feel genuinely invested in what they are doing. And, your presence means so much to them.

Year 6 at St George's: The Tempest

On Thursday evening, six fortunate Year 6 pupils attended St George's Sixth Form production of Shakespeare's final play, *The Tempest* – and by all accounts it was a truly memorable evening. Set on an enchanted island, *The Tempest* weaves together themes of magic, betrayal, love, revenge, and forgiveness. The production brought its characters vividly to life through exceptional scenery, special effects, and haunting music that clearly made a real impression on our pupils. Before the performance, the children took part in a workshop designed to deepen their understanding of the plot and Shakespeare's language – a wonderful introduction to one of the great works of English literature. A huge thank you to St George's for their generous invitation. We hope it's the first of many Shakespeare adventures for our Year 6s!



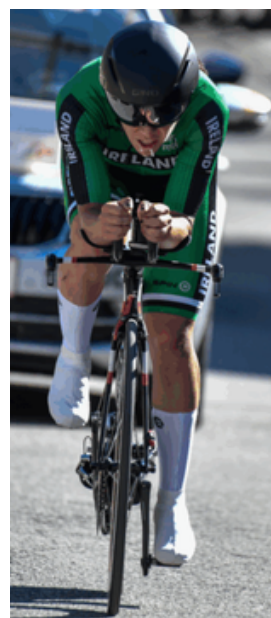
FUEL

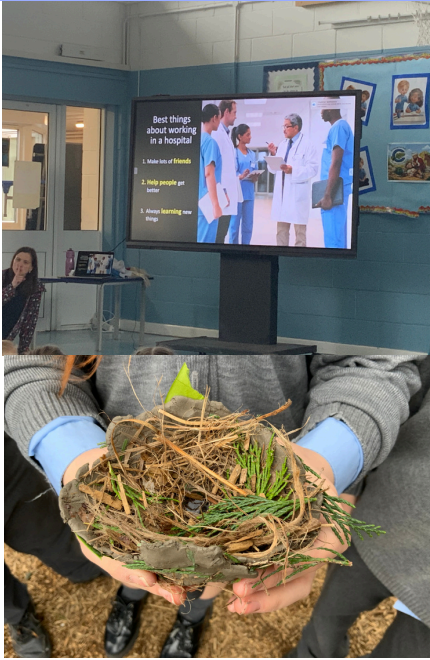
